BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the Matter of the Application of R. S. COLEMAN, for certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate automobile freight service on the public roads and highways between the City of Los Angeles, California, and Pasadena, Pomona, Whittier, Long Beach, Redondo, Venice, Glendale, and intermediate points in the County of Los Angeles, California, and on the public roads and highways between said city of Los Angeles, and the city of Santa Ana in Orange County, California, and intermediate points between the city of Los Angeles, and the city of Santa Ana in Orange County, and on the public roads and highways between said city of Los Angeles and that part of Riverside County and San Bernardino County and the said City of Los Angeles described as follows, to-wit: On all the public roads and highways between said city of Los Angeles and that certain territory in the counties of Riverside and San Bernardino, California, lying west of a straight line running north from the south boundary line of Riverside County, California, through Beaumont in said county and continuing north through San Bernardino County to a point directly opposite to Fredalba, in said San Bernardino County; thence west through Fredalba to the east boundary line of said Los Angeles County, and intermediate points.
