SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 16,249, dated March 18, 1926, the Railroad Commission ordered Rural Union Telephone Company to cease and abandon all utility operations on and after May 1, 1926.

The authorization to the Rural Union Company was granted with the understanding that the town of Franklin and vicinity would be furnished with telephone service on and after May 1, 1926, by Elk Grove Telephone Company. It now appears that Elk Grove Telephone Company will be unable to serve this territory as of this date and that service should be continued by Rural Union Company for a further reasonable length of time until service can be provided by Elk Grove Telephone Company; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the order of this Commission, Decision No. 16,249, dated March 18, 1926, requiring Rural Union Telephone Company to cease and abandon all utility operations on and after May 1, 1926, be cancelled and,

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the Rural Union Tele-

phone Company cease and abandon all utility operations on and after August 2, 1926.
