WHEREAS, M. J. Plasse, to whom the Reilroad Commission in its Decision No.12491, dated August 15, 1923, and issued on Application No.9304, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an automobile service for the transportation of passengers and express, during the summer season only, between Jackson and Plasse's Resort and certain intermediate points, has advised the Commission, under date of April 28,1926, said advice being contained in an annual report filed with the Commission that he "did not operate at all in 1925."

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to M.J. Plasse in Decision No.12491 be, and the same hereby is revoked and annulled.
