## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

William H. Shinn has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order delcaring that public convenience and nocessity require the operation by him of an auto trucking service from ranches within a radius of 15 miles of Lodi and from ranches near

Youngtown to Stockton.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Austin at Stockton and the matter submitted. Under date of March 22,1926, the Railroad Commission advised the applicant, in writing, that the service proposed was not an operation within the meaning of the Auto Stage and Truck Transportation Act in that it was not an operation between fixed points or over a regular route or routes, and that unless within 30 days said application was amended so as to propose a service within the purview of the Act, it would be dismissed without projudice. The 30 days have elapsed, and no amendment has been filed.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without projudice.
