ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Eussey Erothers, co-partners, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by them of an auto trucking service in the vicinity of Vallejo, and from Vallejo to various other points in different sections of the state.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Satterwhite at Vallejo and the matter was temporarily dropped from the calendar to enable applicants to amend their application, and by such amendment propose a service within the meaning of the Auto Stage and Truck Transportation Act, that is, an operation between fixed points or over a regular route, or routes.

Lindauer & Horan, Attorneys for applicants, in a letter dated April 13, 1926, have requested that the application be dismissed without prejudice.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
