ORDER OF DISMISSAL

A public hearing herein was conducted by Examiner Williams at San Diego on April 30, 1926, and applicant having been previously advised that the service proposed in the application

was not an operation within the meaning of the Auto Stage and Truck Transportation Act in that it was not an operation between fixed termini or over a regular route or routes, and continuances having been granted on January 26 and March 25 for the purpose of permitting applicant to amend his application herein, and applicant now at the time of final hearing refusing to make further amendment to his application so as to bring it within the jurisdiction of this Commission;

IT IS HEREBY OFDERED that the application herein be and the same hereby is dismissed for want of jurisdiction.
