ORDER OF DISMISSAL

H. M. Adams and C. L. Adams, partners, doing business under the name of Adams Warehouse Company, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by them of an auto trucking service between Modesto and points within a radius of 200 miles thereof.

Under date of February 4, 1926, the Railroad Commission advised the applicants, in writing, that the service proposed was not an operation within the meaning of the Auto Stage and Truck Transportation Act in that it was not an operation between fixed points or over a regular route or routes, and that unless within 30 days said application was amended so as to propose a service within the purview of the Act, it would be dismissed without prejudice. The 30 days have elapsed, and no amendment has been filed; nor have the applicants answered the Commission's letters dated March 2nd and April 10th and 22nd, containing further reference to their application.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
