ORDER OF DISMISSAL

ORIGINAL

Albert Clinton Fenton has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an auto trucking service in the vicinity of the town of Isleton.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Satterwhite at Rio Vista and the matter temporarily removed from the calendar to give the applicant opportunity to amend his application and propose an operation within the meaning of the Auto Stage and Truck Transportation Act, that is, an operation between fixed points or over a regular route. Letters addressed to S. W. Green, attorney for the applicant, by the Railroad Commission under dates of April 6th and 22nd, 1926, and May 12, 1926, requesting that the Commission be advised as to the intent of applicant, have failed to elicit a response.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
