ORDER OF DISMISSAL

William Hill has petitioned the Railroad Commission for
an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require
the operation by him of an auto trucking service in the vicinity
of Courtland.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Satterwhite at
Sacramento and the matter temporarily dropped from the calendar
to give the applicant opportunity to amend his application and
propose an operation within the meaning of the Auto Stage and
Truck Transportation Act, that is, an operation between fixed
points or over a regular route. No amendment has been filed,
though applicant, through his attorneys, has been advised that his
application would be dismissed without prejudice in the event of
failure to amend.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same
hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
