ORDER OF DISMISSAL

L. K. Peterson has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an auto trucking service within a radius of 100 miles of the town of Hayward and also between Hayward and Fresno and Bakersfield and Hayward, and Monterey and San Francisco.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Satterwhite at Oakland and the matter temporarily removed from the calendar. Under date of July 3, 1926, the Railroad Commission was advised by Wesley W. Kergan, Attorney for the applicant, in writing, that the applicant desired that an Order of Dismissal without prejudice be entered in the matter.
