ORDER OF DISMISSAL

H. S. Dawson, operating under the name of Dawson's Fireproof Storage has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an auto trucking service between Stockton and various points in California.

A public hearing on this application was conducted by Examiner Austin and the matter submitted. Under date of July 16, 1926, the Railroad Commission requested the applicant, in writing, to advise the Commission whether he proposed to operate as a common carrier or as a carrier under private contract. On July 21, 1926, applicant advised that the service he proposed to operate was that of a private contract carrier and requested that an Order of Dismissal be entered in the proceeding. The Railroad Commission has no jurisdiction over any but common carriers.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
