OPINION.

A. B. Sherwood, Jr., has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an auto truck service for the transportation of cement, decomposed granite, gravel, rock and sand as a contract carrier between Plant No. 1, Tajunga (Haynes Canyon) Plants Nos. 2 and 3 at Glendale, Plant No. 4 at Roscoe and those points as shown and indicated in routes 1 to 12 of Exhibit A attached to said application.

A public hearing on said application was conducted by Examiner Satterwhite at Los Angeles, the matter was submitted and is now ready for decision.

Applicant proposes to charge rates and to operate on a time schedule in accordance with Exhibits A and B attached to said application and to use the equipment described in Exhibit C.

There was no opposition to the granting of said application.

The testimony of applicant shows that he has been engaged for some time past in the operation of an auto dump truck service in the transportation of the above named materials for the Haynes Canyon Rock Company from their four plants above named to the various points and places described on the routes in said Exhibit A. The record shows that deliveries are made upon the order of Haynes Canyon Rock Company and the materials are transported by the dump trucks to a building site or the location of the job, as ordered.

Applicant has proposed the continuance of service, which has heretofore been rendered as a contract carrier. The Commission has no jurisdiction over any service other than that of a common carrier and, therefore, the application must be dismissed.

ORDER.

A public hearing having been held in the above entitled application, the matter having been submitted and being now ready for decision,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application, for the reasons set forth in the preceding opinion, be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
