ORDER OF DISMISSAL

W. E. Hibbitt, T. C. Hocking and A. J. Hocking, a co-partnership, doing business under the firm name and style of Lawrence Warehouse and Distributing Company, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by them of an automobile truck line for the transportation of household goods, furniture, pianos, and other personal effects, including trunks and baggage, between points in the State of California.

Applicants, through their Attorney, A. B. Roehl, Esq., have advised the Commission that it is not their intention to confine their operation to regular routes or between fixed termini, and further, that it is not their intention to operate as a common carrier but solely under contract with their patrons. The Railroad Commission has no jurisdiction over other than common carriers.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
