O R D E R

WHEREAS, O. F. Goodrich, doing business under the fictitious name and style of Antelope Valley Telephone Company, has made application to this Commission for authority to establish a charge of five cents (5¢) for each local telephone message made from public pay stations; and

WHEREAS, the furnishing of public pay station service will be in the interest of subscribers of the service of Antelope Valley Telephone Company and to the public, and it appearing that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that O. F. Goodrich doing business under the name and style of Antelope Valley Telephone Company be and he is hereby authorized to charge and collect the sum of five cents (5¢) for each local telephone message made from public pay

stations on and after November 1, 1926, providing such rate be submitted for filing with this Commission on or before October 31, 1926.
