SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

ORIGINAL

WHEREAS, Lloyd S. Tripp, who operates an automobile service for the transportation of passengers, freight, express and baggage between Eagleville and Cedarville and intermediate points, under authority of the Railroad Commission, as shown by Decision No. 11498, dated January 12, 1925, and issued on Application No. 8182, has advised the Commission, in writing, under date of October 7, 1925, that he desires to discontinue the service, having lost a large part of his revenue through failure to secure a renewal of his contract with the U. S. Government to transport U.S. mail.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Lloyd S. Tripp be and he is authorized to discontinue the automobile service hereinabove described and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to Lloyd S. Tripp in Decision No. 11498 be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled.
