O P I N I O N

Pacific Gas and Electric Company asks the Railroad Commission for authority to abandon its gas generating plant in the City of Oroville and for authority to supply that territory by transmitting gas under high pressure from its gas plant in the City of Marysville.

Such action is in line with the present tendency towards the establishment of large central gas production plants, and the abandonment of the smaller inefficient plants.

The Commission's Engineering Department has investigated this matter and finds that favorable action on this application will be in the interests of all parties concerned. Public hearing

is not deemed necessary.

O R D E R

Good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pacific Gas and Electric Company be and it is hereby authorized to abandon its gas manufacturing plant in the City of Oroville, and to supply gas for light, heat and power purposes in the City of Oroville by high pressure transmission from its gas plant in the City of Marysville.

The effective date hereof will be the date of this order.
