FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

William Duelke, complainant herein, having on August 18, 1926, requested that the condition, "IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Pacific Electric Railway Company be and it is hereby ordered to muffle the bell on the existing automatic flagman at its crossing of Manchester Avenue, Los Angeles County", in Commission's Decision No. 11828, in the above entitled proceeding, be so modified that the bell on said automatic flagman be restored to its normal ringing condition, and it appearing that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary, and that said request should be granted; therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the condition in Commission's Decision No. 11828, stated as follows:

"IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Pacific Electric Railway Company be and it is hereby ordered to muffle the bell on the existing automatic flagman at its crossing of Manchester Avenue, Los Angeles County,"

be and the same is hereby ordered rescinded, subject, however, to the following condition:

Pacific Electric Railway Company shall restore the bell on said automatic flagman to its normal ringing condition.

In all other respects this Commission's order heretofore entered in the above entitled proceeding shall remain in full force and effect.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
