ORDER OF DISMISSAL

C.E. Essley, operating under the name and style of C. E. Essley Trucking Company, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile service for the transportation of freight between Santa Fe Springs and Whittier and adjacent territory and such points in Southern California as shippers may require.

A public hearing on this application was conducted by Examiner Austin at Los Angeles and the matter was dropped from the calendar temporarily. Under date of November 6, 1926, Richard T. Eddy, Attorney for applicant, in writing, requested that the application be dismissed, without prejudice.
