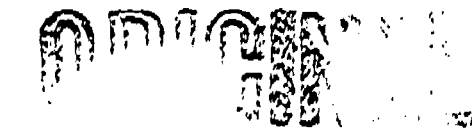

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

A. Y. Sale has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile service for the transportation of property between Los Angeles and oil fields in a territory extending as far north as Porterville.

A public hearing on this application was conducted by Examiner Austin at Los Angeles on June 15, 1926, and the matter temporarily dropped from the calendar. On November 29, 1926, applicant Sale wired to the Commission a request that his application be dismissed, without prejudice.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
