In the matter of the Application of Southern Pacific Company for authority to abandon non-agency station at Prince, County of Contra Costa, State of California.

BY THE COMMISSION:

OBINION

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above entitled application with this Commission on the 6th day of October, 1926, asking for permission to abandon and eliminate from its records the non-agency station of Prince, on its Western Division, in Contra Costa County, California.

Applicant alleges that Prince Station is located within the switching limits of Antioch; that no passenger business has been transacted at said station during the yearly period ending June 20th, 1926; that the proposed abandonment does not involve the abandonment of any facilities nor affect any of the service now afforded to shippers in the vicinity, and that the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or of its patrons.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon its non-agency station of Prince on its Western Division, four-tenths (0.4)

miles west of Antioch, County of Contra Costa, State of California, and to eliminate said station from its records, subject to the following condition:

(1) Nothing in this order is to be construed that the facilities at said Prince Station are to be abandoned or removed.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
