SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, Clarence E. Hartman, to whom the Railroad Commission, in its Decision No. 16332, dated March 30, 1926, and issued on Application No. 11261 granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an automobile service for the transportation of freight (fresh fruit and vegetables), between Los Angeles and Burbank, has advised the Commission, in writing, under date of January 18, 1927, that the service performed by him is not that of a common carrier between fixed points or over a regular route or routes, and

WHEREAS, said Clarence E. Hartman has requested that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to him by the Railroad Commission in Decision No. 16332 be revoked and annulled.
