## ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its non-agency station of Fitchburg on its Western Division in Alameda County.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business was transacted at the non-agency station of Fitchburg during the annual period ending July 31, 1926; that no less than carload business was transacted at said station during said annual period; that carload freight business in amount of \$2,153. was transacted at said station during the same period; that said station is within the switching limits of the Oakland Yard, Alameda County; that the nearest agency stations on each side of said station are Elmburst 1.4 miles east and Fruitvale 2.3 miles west; that the abandonment of said non-agency station will not involve the abandonment of any facilities; and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter

in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station of Fitchburg located on the Main Line of its Western Division in Alameda County and to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records; provided, however, that coincident with the abandonment of said non-agency station applicant will not abandon or remove the facilities at said Fitchburg Station.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
