### OPINION

This is a proceeding instituted by the Commission on its own motion for the purpose of making an investigation of the rates, charges, practices, rules and regulations of Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation, applicable to its electric light and power business in Mendocino County.

Under the authority of Decision No. 17393, dated September 25, 1926, the business and properties of Mendocino Electric Light & Power Company were transferred to Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation, and later, under the authority of Decision No. 17448, dated October 13, 1926, Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation acquired the business and properties of Fort Bragg

Electric Company. On November 15, 1926, it began the operation of the two properties as a unified system.

At the present time Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation distributes electric energy within Mendocino County in the City of Fort Bragg and the towns of Mendocino, Caspar, Little River and Albion and in the adjacent and intervening territory. A total of approximately fifteen hundred (1500) consumers are supplied with lighting and power service.

Electric energy is purchased from Union Lumber Company and distributed by means of some thirty (30) miles of distribution pole lines.

The rates now being charged on the portion of the system which was formerly operated by Mendocino Electric Light & Power Company have been in effect without change for over ten years. The rates charged on the balance of the system are those placed in effect in the year 1922, when metered service was first established by Fort Bragg Electric Company.

Public hearings in the present proceeding were held before Examiner Fankhauser on December 6, 1926, and February 11,1927, testimony being introduced and the matter submitted for decision.

Mr. C. T. Mess of the Commission's Engineer Department submitted and explained exhibits dealing with valuation of physical properties, reasonable rate base for the year 1927, estimates of revenue and expenses for the year 1927, reasonable rate of return and proposed rates to yield such rate of return.

No evidence as to the proper rate base, revenues or operating expenses was submitted by either People's California Hydro-Electric Corporation or the City of Fort Bragg, represented by its City Attorney Leonard Stone, or by anyone else, other than

C. T. Mess.

The evidence before the Commission shows the reasonable rate base for the year 1927 to be One Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$162,000.00), details of which are set forth below:

consideration of the above estimates of revenue and expenses indicates a net revenue of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), or a return of 9.25 per cent upon the reasonable rate base. The rates prescribed by the order following will yield about eight and a half (8-1/2) per cent. The operating expenses, however, include no allowance for the purchase of oil under the company's power contract or for extraordinary maintenance.

counsel for the Company stipulated that his company was willing to put the rates proposed by C. T. Mess in effect and that if such rates result in revenues that the company feels under all the circumstances can be reduced, it is their intention to reduced.

them. The City Attorney for Fort Bragg raised no objection to placing the proposed rates into effect, but requested that the rates be regarded as tentative and that this proceeding be kept open, and that the Commission after a definite period, say, a year, review the results produced by the rates put into effect by the Commission's order. We have considered the request of the City Attorney but feel that in view of our procedure in matters of this kind there is no necessity to keep this proceeding open.

A general analysis of the existing rates indicates the necessity of standardizing the schedules with due recognition to special classes of service. Such standardization is of particular importance in the present instance as two former systems with differing rate schedules are now operating as a single system.

To continue in effect differing rates for the same class of service is discriminatory. The rates proposed by C. T. Mess remove the discrimination and such rates, with a slight modification, will be placed in effect.

### ORDER

The Railroad Commission having instituted a proceeding on its own motion to make a complete investigation of the rates, service, rules, regulations and practices of Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation in Mendocino County, hearings having been held, the matter submitted and now being ready for decision;

The Railroad Commission hereby finds as a fact that the electric rates of Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation are not just and reasonable rates in so far as they differ from the rates herein established, which rates are found to be just

and reasonable.

Basing this order on the foregoing findings of fact and the findings of fact contained in the opinion which precedes this order

#### IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that

- l. Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation be and it is hereby authorized to charge and collect for electric service rendered, effective for all regular meter readings taken on and after March 20,1927, the schedule of rates as set forth in Exhibit "A", said exhibit being attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 2. Peoples California Hydro-Electric Corporation shall file with the Railroad Commission on or before March 25,1927, the schedule of rates herein established.

For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
