SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

San Diego Electric Railway Company, a corporation, having on February 23, 1927, filed with the Commission its supplemental application in the above entitled proceeding, asking that the route of the motor bus service described on Page 9 of Decision No. 13,114, dated February 4, 1924, reading as follows:

From the intersection of Bacon and Voltaire Streets easterly on Voltaire Street to Chatsworth Boulevard and southerly on Chatsworth Boulevard to its intersection with Catalina Boulevard

be amended to read as follows:

From the intersection of Bacon and Voltaire Streets easterly on Voltaire Street to San Clemente Street.

A franchise (Ordinance No. 9515) has been granted by the City Council of the City of San Diego for the operation of a motor coach service, over last mentioned route. Certified copy of said Ordinance has been filed as exhibit "A" in Case No. 2288. It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that said supplemental application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY URDERED that the motor coach route described on Page 9 of Decision No. 13,114, reading as follows:

From the intersection of Bacon and Voltaire Streets easterly on Voltaire Street to Chatsworth Boulevard and southerly on Chatsworth Boulevard to its intersection with Catalina Boulevard

be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

From the intersection of Bacon and Voltaire Streets easterly on Voltaire Street to San Clemente Street.

In all other respects this Commission's Order heretofore entered in the above entitled proceeding shall remain in full force and effect.
