WHEREAS, said Charles Mister and Scott Lawton. co-partners, have requested that the certificate heretofore issued to them by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No.16985, which certificate authorized the operation of a trucking service for the transportation of fruit, farm products and farm supplies between Oroville on the one hand and Palermo, Durham, Corning and Olinda on the other, be cancelod,

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the cortificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to Kister & Lawton in Decision No.16985 be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled.
