SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, J. D. Maynard, to whom the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 10289, dated April 6, 1922, and issued on Application No. 6700, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an auto trucking service as a

"limited common carrier of vine berries between the berry districts within a radius of three miles from Gilroy and Oakland and San Francisco, and between the berry districts within a radius of four miles from Betabel, and Oakland and San Francisco,"

has, under date of April 18, 1927, petitioned for an order of the Commission authorizing him to abandon said truck service, and

WHEREAS, said J. D. Maynard, in support of said petition declares:

That the berry districts as they existed at the time of the issuance of said decision No. 10289 have been changed and that it is no longer profitable to haul berries from the districts fixed in said decision.

That many of the ranchers engaged in raising vine berries within the districts fixed by said decision now haul their vine berries to market in their own trucks.

That there are many so-called contract carriers by automobile truck engaged in hauling from the ranchers within said districts heretofore served by said applicant.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that J. D. Maynard be and he hereby is authorized to discontinue auto trucking service operated by him under authority of Decision No. 10289, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to J.D. Maynard in Decision No. 10289 be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled.
