SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, T. J. Silva has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order revoking the certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of an auto trucking service for the transportation of fruit and vegetables from East San Jose, San Leandro and intermediate points to Oakland and San Francisco, granted to him by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No.10594, dated June 16, 1922, and issued on Application No.7773, and

WHEREAS, said T. J. Silva in said petition declares that he is not now serving and never has served as a common carrier but has limited his service to certain persons with whom he has entered into private contract covering said hauling service, and

WHEREAS, said T. J. Silva further declares that the requirements of the persons with whom he contracts to do hauling make it impossible for him to serve the general public as a common carrier, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to T. J. Silva by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No.10594 be and the same

heroby is revoked and annulled, with the understanding, however, that this order shall in no wise be construed as a determination by the Railroad Commission of the character of the operations of said E. J. Silva.
