This is an application of California Telephone and Light Company, a corporation, for an order approving a certain agreement dated February 1, 1927, made and entered into by and between applicant and Sulphur Bank Syndicate. A copy of this agreement, marked Exhibit "A", is attached to the application. The agreement provides for the sale and purchase of energy under the applicant's Schedule Number P-5 for a term of five (5) years from and after commencement of service.

The Commission is of the opinion that the agreement is fair to both parties and that a public hearing in this proceeding is not necessary.

California Telephone and Light Company having applied to this Commission for an order approving a certain agreement entered into between applicant and Sulphur Bank Syndicate, dated
