Decision No. 184/6

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the Matter of the Joint Application of El Dorsdo Water Corporation, a corporation, and El Dorsdo Irrigation District, for an order from the Railroad Commission of the State of California to authorize the former to sell and convey and the latter to purchase and acquire the properties heroinafter described; and for an order authorizing the El Dorsdo Water Corporation to cease furnishing water to the public use.

## FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission by its Decision No. 18289, dated April 28, 1927, authorized El Dorado Water Corporation, a corporation, to sell and convey its public utility properties, referred to in this application, to El Dorado Irrigation District, an irrigation district; providing, among other things, that the indentures of conveyance contain the covenants set forth in Exhibit "A" attached to the application, and further providing that the lands and water users now being served by the El Dorado Water Corporation continue to receive water at equitable rates from the District to at loast the same extent as the water corporation was obligated to furnish the same.

Under date of May 17, 1927, applicants filed with the Commission a petition for a supplemental order to amend the form

of conveyance filed with the original application, which was referred to in the Commission's Decision No. 18289, and to make the transfer in accordance with the terms of the revised form of conveyance attached to the supplemental petition and marked Exhibit "A".

The Commission is further asked that the provisions in the order providing for the service of water by the District to the water users of the El Dorado Water Corporation, as set out in the Commission's Decision No. 18289, be also amended in order to afford certain of the users botter protection.

The Commission has considered the requests of applicants and believes that such requests are reasonable and should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Order in Decision No. 18289, dated April 28, 1927, be and it is hereby amended and that El Dorado Water Corporation, a corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to transfer to El Dorado Irrigation District its irrigation system and water proporties as more particularly described in and subject to the terms and conditions of Exhibit "A", attached to the petition for an amended and supplemental order herein and hereby made a part hereof, except that the consideration to be paid by El Dorado Irrigation District to El Dorado Water Corporation for said deed shall be \$265,527.63.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the indenture or indentures of transfer to be executed by El Dorado Water Corporation for the properties herein authorized to be conveyed shall provide, among other things, that El Dorado Irrigation District shall serve and continue to serve with water land and users of water, including, amongst others, the City of Placorville now served by the El Dorado Water Corporation with water, to at least the same extent as El Dorado Water Corporation was obliged to furnish water, and any owner or owners of such land or any such user or users of water shall be entitled upon and after the delivery of said transfer to obtain water from El Dorado Irrigation District to at least the same extent as El Dorado Water Corporation was obliged to furnish water. Any tolls or charges that may be charged or fixed for such water or services by El Dorado Irrigation District shall be fair and equitable.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that El Dorado Water Corporation shall file with this Commission within thirty (30) days after the transfer of its properties to the El Dorado Irrigation District a statement covering its operations from the first day of January, 1927, to the date of said transfer of its properties.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that, except as modified herein, Decision No. 18289, dated April 28, 1927, shall remain in full force and effect and shall become effective upon the date hereof.
