SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, John H. Heriford, to whom the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 12095, dated May 18, 1923, and issued on Application No. 8985, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing him to operate an automobile service for the transportation of passengers and property between Lemoore and Murray, has advised the Commission in writing, under date of May 25, 1927, that with the loss of his mail contract on June 30, 1926, he discontinued operation of said automobile service, now

Therefore, good cause appearing.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the operating right heretofore granted to said John H. Heriford in Decision No. 12095 be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said John H. Heriford shall immediately issue supplements to tariffs and time schedules on file in his name with the Railroad Commission withdrawing said tariffs and time schedules, which supplements shall be issued in conformity with the requirements of the Railroad Commission's General Order No. 51.
