SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, Louis, Joe, Frank and Carl Zwissig, co-partners, to whom the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 16317, dated March 29, 1926, and issued on Application No. 11550, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an auto trucking service for the transportation of milk between Decoto and San Francisco, have advised the Commission, in writing, under date of May 21, 1927, that they have discontinued operation of said service, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to said Louis, Joe, Frank and Carl Zwissig be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said partnership shall immediately file supplements to tariffs and time schedules on file in its name with the Railroad Commission, which supplements shall withdraw said tariffs and time schedules and be issued in accordance with the requirements of General Order No. 51 of the Railroad Commission.
