In the matter of the application of Southern Pacific Company for an order authorizing the construction at grade of a side track across M Street and three side tracks across O Street, in the City of Merced, County of Merced, State of California.

BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, applicant herein, having on May 13, 1927, made written request for a modification of Condition (2) of this Commission's Decision No. 18320, dated May 3, 1927 in the above entitled proceeding, to allow of the construction at "M" Street of a Standard No. 3 Crossing as specified in this Commission's General Order No. 72 in lieu of the Standard No. 4 Crossing specified in said Condition (2), and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the request is reasonable and should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition (2) of said Decision No. 18320, dated May 3, 1927, be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Said crossings of "O" Street shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 2 in General Order No. 72 of this Commission and said crossing of "M" Street shall be constructed substantially in accordance

with Standard No. 3 of said General Order; both crossings shall be constructed without super-elevation and of a width to conform to those portions of said streets now graded, with the tops of rails at same elevation as main line rails and flush with the roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding two (2) per cent; shall be protected by suitable crossing signs and shall in every way be made safe for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.

In all other respects this Commission's Decision No. 18320, dated May 3, 1927, in the above entitled proceeding shall remain in full force and effect.
