SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, in Decision No.18353, dated May 14, 1927, and issued on Application No.13748, the Railroad Commission granted to George J. Carr authority to transport express between La Honda and San Gregorio and Redwood City and intermediate points, and

WHEREAS, R. E. Woodhams, who operates an automobile freight and express service between said points, has advised the Commission that he would not oppose the granting of said authority to George J. Carr, provided his express service was limited to the transportation of property no single piece of which weighed in excess of 100 pounds, and

WHEREAS, through inadvertence, the order of the Commission in Decision No.18353 did not contain a provision so limiting the express service authorized to be performed by said Carr, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No.18353 be and the same hereby is amended by the addition of the following paragraph as Provision No.5:

5- That no single piece of express matter transported by George J. Carr under authority of the certificate herein granted shall weigh in excess of 100 pounds.

In all other respects Decision No.18355 is to remain unchanged.
