SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

This Commission in its Decision No. 18,009, dated February 21, 1927, authorized certain increased schedules to be filed in lieu of the schedules then applying for mixed gas service in applicant's Western District. Applicant filed only that schedule designated as Schedule No. "A," applicable to general domestic and commercial service.

It now appears advisable to authorize applicant to file certain schedules differing slightly from those previously authorized, but not placed in effect, and which will more nearly conform to existing conditions.

Good cause therefore appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that

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1. Decision No. 12,009 be and the same is hereby

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amended as follows:

That the portion of Exhibit "A," designated as Schedules No. 3-B, 3-C, 3-D and 3-E, are hereby cancelled.

3. Southern Counties Gas Company of California file with this Commission on or before June <u>//</u>, 1927, the schedule of rates herein authorized.

4. For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.

The foregoing Supplemental Opinion and Order are hereby approved and ordered filed as the Opinion and Order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.

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EXCILBIT "B"

SCHEDULE NO. 3-A-A

(Superseding Schedule No. 3-D)

SURPLUS COMMERCIAL SERVICE:

ipplicable to commercial service for space and water heating and general use in apartments, hotels, restaurants, and business buildings.

Natural Gas.

TERRITORY:

Applicable to Western District including Santa Monica, Palms, Venice, Ocean Park, Culver City, Sawtolle and adjacont territory.

RATE:

70¢ per 1,000 cubic feet.

MINIMUM CHARGE:

\$15.00 per meter per month.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

Consumers served under this Schedule have priority in the use of gas over consumers served under Schedules No. 3-B, No. 3-C, No. 3-DN and No. 3-EN, but are subject to the prior use of consumers served under Schedule No. 3-A, at times when the supply is insufficient for the demands of all consumers.

SCHEDULE NO. 3-C

(Superseding Schedules No. 3-C and No. 3-E.)

COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL SERVICE:

Applicable to commercial and industrial service such as bakeries, packing houses, metal working plants, preserving and canning establishments, fruit and vegetable dryers and other consumers whose demands for gas are not dependent upon atmospheric temperature, or upon the preparation of meals and whose times of maximum demand, if any, do not coincide with the maximum demand of consumers served under Schedules No. 3-A and 3-A-A.

Natural Cas.

TERRITORY:

Applicable to Western District including Santa Monica, Venice, Ocean Park, Culver City, Palms, Sawtelle and adjacent territory.

RATE:

First50,000 cu.ft. per meter per month\$.70 per M.C.F.Next150,000 cu.ft. per meter per month.60 per M.C.F.All over200,000 cu.ft. per meter per month.55 per M.C.F.

MINIMUM CHARGE:

\$8.00 per meter per month.

For continuous yearly service, accumulative annual minimum of \$96.00 per meter.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

Consumers served under this sheedule have priority in the use of gas over consumers served under Schedules No. 3-DN and No. 3-EN, but are subject to the prior use of consumers served under Schedules No. 3-A and 3-A-A, and 3-B, at times when there is insufficient gas to supply the demands of all consumers.
