SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.


Whereas, Paul Cardinal, to whom the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 13047, dated January 15, 1924, and issued on application No. 9689, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity for an automobile service for the transportation of freight between Brawley and Westmorland, has advised the Commission, in writing, under date of June 4, 1927, that he has discontinued operation of said service and request that the certificate of public convenience and necessity for such a service be revoked, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore issued to Paul Cardinal in Decision No. 13047, be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said Paul Cardinal shall immediately file supplements to tariffs and time schedules on file in his name with the Railroad Commission which supplements shall withdraw said tariffs and time schedules.
