IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to R. G. Chase in Decision No.16562 be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled, and

IT IS MERBY FURTHER ORDERED that said R.G. Chase shall immediately file supplements to tariffs and time schedules on file in his name with the Hailroad Commission, which supplements shall withdraw said tariffs and time schedules.
