SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Whereas the Railroad Commission, in its Decision No. 18543, ordered that Raymond Telephone Company, unincorporated, might file and make effective certain rates as set forth therein after approval by Supplemental Order, after a showing by Raymond Telephone Company that it had so rearranged its telephone circuits that none of its lines had connected subscribers' stations in more than one of the zones as set forth in Exhibit "B", attached to said decision, and

Whereas the Railroad Commission has evidence to the effect that Raymond Telephone Company has complied with the conditions of the Order in Decision No. 18543, dated June 27, 1927,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Raymond Telephone Company be and it is hereby authorized to publish, file and make effective, as of August 1, 1927, rates for service in accordance with the schedules and maps shown in Exhibits "A", "B" and "C" of this Commission's Decision No. 18543, together with rules and regulations governing service as may be approved by this Commission, providing such schedules of rates and maps, and rules

and regulations be submitted for filing with this Commission on or before July 31, 1927.

For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
