SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, Thomas Halbert Williams, to whom the Railroad Commission in its Decisions Nos. 11468 and 11761, dated respectively January 6, 1923, and March 6, 1923, and issued on Application No. 8438, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an automobile service for the transportation of eggs and poultry supplies between Chino and other points and Los Angeles, has, in writing, under date of July 12, 1927, requested that his certificate be revoked, and

WHEREAS, said Thomas Halbert Williams has advised the Commission that because of decrease in membership in the Poultry Producers' Association, largely for whom said service was performed and the activities of independent haulers, said service is no longer productive of profit, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to Thomas Halbert Williams in said Decisions Nos. 11468 and 11761 be and the same hereby is revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said Thomas Halbert Williams shall immediately file supplements to tariffs and time

schedules filed by him under authority of said Decisions
Nos. 11468 and 11761 withdrawing said tariffs and time schedules.
