In the matter of the application of Southern Pacific Company for authority to abandon non-agency station at Lake Vineyard, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its non-agency station of Lake Vineyard on its Duarte Branch, Los Angeles Division in Los Angeles County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business was transacted at the non-agency station of Lake Vineyard during the annual period ending June 30th, 1927; that no freight business was transacted at said station during said annual period; and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

The California Farm Bureau Federation advises, through its manager, J. J. Deuel, that it has no objections to the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station of Lake Vineyard, located on the Duarte Branch of its Los Angeles Division in Los Angeles County, State of California, and to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
