## ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:-

- 1. Euclid Avenue Water Company may issue its unsecured promissory note in the principal amount of not exceeding \$4,000.00 payable on or before one year after date with interest at not exceeding seven percent per annum, the proceeds of said note to be used to pay or refund the \$4,000.00 note issued pursuant to said Decision No. 17612, dated November 12, 1926. If applicant issues a note for less than one year, it may renew the same provided that the term of the original note and the term of any renewal note or notes does not extend beyond one year after the date of the note herein authorized to be issued.
- 2. Euclid Avenue Water Company shall file with the Railroad Commission a copy of each and every note issued under the authority herein granted.
