ORDER

The Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above-entitled application with this Commission on the 27th day of October, 1926, asking for authority to construct a spur track at grade across 14th Street and a portion of "E" Street in the City of Marysville, County of Yuba, State of California, as hereinafter set forth. The necessary franchise or permit (Ordinance No. 254) has been granted by the City Council of said City for the construction of said crossing at grade. It appears to this Commission that the present proceeding is not one in which a public hearing is necessary; that it is neither reasonable nor practicable at this time to provide a grade separation or to avoid a grade crossing at the points mentioned in this application with said 14th Street and a portion of "E" Street and that this application should be granted subject to the conditions horeinafter specified, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be

thence continuing along last described line, crossing 11th Street, 12th Street and 13th Street, a distance of 1219.9 feet to a point in the center line of track and on southerly line of 14th Street; thence along a curve concave to the right, with radius of 458.59 feet, crossing 14th Street, an arc distance of 61.5 feet to a point; thence along a line tangent to last mentioned curve and making an angle of 60 contact the contact of 50 contact of 22' with the center line of Yuba Manufacturing Company's track, a distance of 123.5 feet to a point. This point is in the center line of the existing lead to Yuba Manufacturing Company's track and lies in E Street 16.5 ft. westerly from and at right angles to Engineer's Station 17+08.1 in the center line of the Southern Pacific Company's E Street Branch Railroad to Binney Junction and 105.1 feet northerly of the northerly line of 14th Street.

The above crossings shall be identified as Crossing No. AF-122.1.

A. I Home . Said crossings to be constructed subject to the following conditions, namely:

(1) The entire expense of constructing the crossings together with the cost of their maintenance thereafter in good and first-class condition for the safe and convenient use of the public,

- (2) Said crossings shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 3, in General Order No. 72 of this Commission and shall be constructed without superelevation and of a width to conform to those portions of said streets now graded, with the tops of rails flush with the pavement, and with grades of approach not exceeding one (1) per cent; shall be protected by suitable crossing signs and shall in every way be made safe for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.
- (3) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the completion of the installation of said crossings.
- (4) If said crossings shall not have been installed within one year from the date of this order, the authorization herein granted shall them lapse and become void, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.
- (5) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenence and protection of said crossings as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
