WHEREAS, Pacific Highway Express, Inc., to which this Commission in its Decision No. 17312, dated September 8, 1926, and issued on Application No. 12378, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an automotive service for the transportation of household goods between Los Angeles and San Francisco and intermediate points, via what is known as the "Valley Route", has, through its president, J. R. Zimmerman, advised the Commission, in writing, under date of December 17, 1927, that Pacific Highway Express, Inc., has discontinued the operation authorized in said decision, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted by Decision No. 17312 be, and the same is hereby revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said Pacific Highway Express, Inc., shall immediately file with the Railroad Commission supplements to its tariffs and time schedules which supplements shall cancel said tariffs and time schedules.
