O P I N I O N

Belvedere Water Corporation, applicant in the above entitled proceeding, operating a public utility water system supplying water to a large territory adjacent to the easterly boundary of the City of Los Angeles, known as Belvedere, asks the Railroad Commission for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to extend its system into contiguous territory.

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examiner Williams at Los Angeles, after due notice thereof had been given so that all interested parties might appear and be heard.

Applicant is financially able to extend its water distribution facilities and render adequate service throughout

the area in those portions of Los Angeles County particularly described in the instant application as follows:

"Beginning at the point of intersection of the southerly boundary line of the Right of Way of the L.A. & S.L. R.R. and the northwesterly corner of Tract 7777 as shown on Map recorded in Book 115, pages 13 & 14, of Map Records of the County of Los Angeles, thence southeasterly along said south Boundary Line of L.A. & S.L. R.R. S. $83^{\circ}-53'-35''$ E. 729.96', thence in a curvilinear direction an arc distance of 200.26' intersecting the prolongation of the northeasterly boundary line of Gates Street at a distance of 575' from the northwesterly boundary line of Tract 7777, thence southeasterly S. $43^{\circ}-16'-10''$ E. a distance of 638.48' thence southwesterly S. $46^{\circ}-43'-50''$ W. a distance of 575' to a point of intersection of said line and the northwesterly boundary line of Tract 7777, the said boundary line of Tract 7777 being the southeasterly boundary line of Anaheim Telegraph Road, thence along said northwesterly boundary line of Tract 7777 1399.52' in all its various courses back to the point of beginning."

The pipe lines and appurtenant fixtures will be installed in this territory prior to the dedication of the streets and alleys therein to the public and under such circumstances a county franchise will not be required. No one protested granting the application for extension and, as there is no other public utility water system now furnishing water within the territory, it appears that the request should be granted.

ORDER

Belvedere Water Corporation having made application as entitled above, a public hearing having been held thereon, the matter having been submitted and the Commission being now fully

advised in the premises,

The Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby declares that public convenience and necessity require and will require that Belvedere Water Corporation operate a water system for the purpose of supplying water to consumers in the area more particularly described in the opinion preceding this order.

The authority granted herein shall become effective on the date hereof.
