BY THE COMMISSION:

O P I N I O N

Sanger Telephone Company, a public telephone utility owned and operated by H. F. Knapp, requests the Railroad Commission to issue its order authorizing applicant to file and make effective a rule governing charges for moves and changes of telephone equipment and wiring.

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examiner Satterwhite in Sanger on February 1, 1928.

Evidence taken at the hearing indicated that charges for moves and changes of telephone equipment were in effect and collected generally by telephone companies throughout the State of California. Applicant's witness, Mr. H. F. Knapp, testified that the application of the charges requested would have no appreciable effect on applicant's total revenues.

No one appeared to protest against the petition of applicant and there appears no good reason why this application should not be granted.

O R D E R

Application having been made by Sanger Telephone Company asking for an order authorizing applicant to file and place in effect certain charges for moves and changes of telephone equipment, a hearing having been had, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission being now fully advised,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Sanger Telephone Company be and it is hereby authorized to file and make effective as of April 1 1928, the following rule and regulation:

MOVES AND CHANGES.

Moves and changes of telephone apparatus and wiring on the subscribers' premises, at the request of the subscriber, will be made by the Company, and the charges for such work will be as follows:

A. Telephone Sets.

1. Moving from one location to another in same room,.....\$1.50
From one room to another,..... 2.50
2. Change in type or style,..... 1.50

B. Other Equipment and Wiring.

Charges for moving or changing of equipment or wiring other than that included under "A" above, will be an amount equal to the actual cost of labor and material involved.

C. Maintenance.

The charges specified above do not apply if the changes or moves are initiated by the Telephone Company and required for the proper maintenance of the equipment or service.

D. Change in Class of Service.

The charges specified above do not apply if the changes are required because of a change in type, class or grade of service.

The authority herein granted is subject to the condition that said rule and regulation be submitted for filing with this Commission on or before March 31 1928.

For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
