SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER**ORIGINAL**

WHEREAS, I. J. Mc Intire, engaged in the business of hauling milk and dairy supplies between points in the vicinity of Long Beach and Long Beach under authority of a certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to him by Decision No. 18405, has advised the Railroad Commission, in writing, under date of March 8, 1928, that he is no longer operating in accordance with the requirements of said certificate, but is transporting milk as an employee of the Crescent Creamery Company, now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to said I. J. Mc Intire by said Decision No. 18405, be and the same is hereby revoked and annulled, with the understanding, however, that the order herein shall in no wise be construed as a determination by the Railroad Commission of the character of the operations of said I. J. Mc Intire, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said I. J. Mc Intire shall immediately file supplements to tariffs and time schedules on file in his name with the Railroad Commission, which supplements shall cancel said tariffs and time schedules.
