BY THE COMMISSION: OPINION In this proceeding the Key System Transit Company requests permission to permanently abandon its so-called Fernside motor bus line, operated along High Street between Oakland and Alameda. A public hearing was held before Exeminer Gannon in Oakland on March 15th, 1928. On July 10th, 1924, the Fernside motor coach line went into operation under authority of Decision No. 14492, dated January 27th,1925, in Case No. 1989. The route along High Street between Oakland and Alameda crossed the estuary on the High Street Bridge. On May 23rd, 1927, the operation of this motor bus line was temporarily abandoned on account of the closing of the bridge. At the hearing in this proceeding, it was stipulated by the parties that the lightness of the traffic on this line during the -1period it was in operation, indicated that public convenience and necessity did not warrant the re-establishment of this service and that the application should be granted.

## ORDER

Key System Transit Company, a corporation, having made application for permission to abandon motor coach service along High Street between Oakland and Alameda, a public hearing having been held, the matter being under submission and ready for decision, therefore,

IT IS HEPEBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Key System Transit Company to abandon its motor bus service, operating between a terminus at Santa Clara Avenue and High Street, in the City of Alameda, and a terminus at Ygnacio Avenue and High Street, in the City of Oakland, and intermediate points, in the County of Alameda, State of California.
