Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its non-agency station of Gunter on its Sacramento Division in Placer County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business nor freight business, either in carload or less than carload lots, was transacted at the non-agency station of Gunter during the annual period ending December 31st, 1927; that the abandonment of said non-agency station will not involve the abandonment of any facilities; and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

The California Farm Bureau Federation has been consulted in this matter and through its Manager, J. J. Deuel, has advised applicant that it has no objection to the granting of said

application.

IV

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station of Gunter, located on the main line of its Sacramento Division in Placer County and to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records; provided, however, that coincident with the abandonment of said non-agency station applicant will cancel all rates in freight and passenger tariffs from and to said non-agency station.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
