OPINION.

This is an application of Pacific Electric Railway Company for authority to abandon service and remove its tracks on its Smiley Heights line in the City of Redlands.

A public hearing herein was conducted by Examiner Williams on March 29th, 1928, at Redlands, at which time the matter was taken under submission.

At the hearing, O.A.Smith, Passenger Traffic Manager for applicant, testified that an agreement between the City of Redlands and Pacific Electric Railway Company had been reached prior to the hearing, to the effect that if the Pacific Electric Railway would continue to operate the line the City would not require the Company to pave its tracks on Cypress Avenue, Center Street, or Cedar Avenue when these streets are improved with an expensive type of paving.
