Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to A. E. Thym by said Decision No.10714 be, and the same is hereby revoked and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said A.E. Thym shall immediately file supplements to tariffs and time schedules on file in his name with the Railroad Commission, which supplements shall cancel said tariffs and time schedules.
