FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good Cause Appearing:

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that Los Angeles County Water Works and Gardena Valley Water Company have filed in the above entitled matter a stipulation duly authorized by their Boards of Directors declaring that they, their successors and assigns, will never claim before the Railroad Commission or any court or other public body a value for the rights and privileges granted under Ordinance No. 906 (new series) passed by the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County on August 20, 1923, in excess of the amount actually paid to the County of Los Angeles as a consideration for the granting of such rights and privileges, which cost is reported at One Hundred (\$100.) Dollars.
